On Thursday this week the Auckland Council PACE Committee resolved to remove the proposal to formally incorporate 21 of 28 regional parks into the Hauraki Gulf Marine Park (at the same time as the Hauraki Gulf Forum seeks to reinvent itself as a co-governed 'Authority' with increased powers).

John writes: "The decision is a victory for all those committed to preserving the integrity and democratic accountability of our regional park network so valued by Aucklanders across the region" and:
